CRC SURVEY MEASURES OF TEACHERS' PROFESSIONAL COMMUNITY, COMMITMENT, AND INSTRUCTIONAL ADAPTATION¹

These survey measures were constructed using the 1991 CRC teacher survey instrument and data (N= 16 schools; 630 teachers). Items used to construct each scale are identified by their number in the CRC 1991 Teacher Questionnaire. In some instances, CRC survey items replicate teacher survey items from the 1984 ATS national survey (part of the High School & Beyond Program conducted by the National Center for Educational Statistics); the corresponding ATS question number is reported in parentheses. A "V" following an item indicates that the item values were reversed for inclusion in the scale. For each scale, the number of component items and their internal consistency (Alpha reliability score) are indicated.

I. PROFESSIONAL COMMUNITY INDICATORS

A. Collegiality (5-item scale: Alpha=.84)

CRC #29 (ATS #19). Using the scale provided, please indicate the extent to which you agree or disagree with each of the following statements:

- w (x). Teachers in this school are continually learning and seeking new ideas

² A global measure of <u>Teacher Learning Opportunities</u> (8 items; Alpha=.85) combines the <u>Support for Learning</u> items (18a, b), items from the <u>Faculty Innovation</u> scale (18e, i, t, ee), and two additional items: 18k. "The staff seldom evaluates its programs and activities" (reverse coded) and 18w. "Teachers in this school are constantly learning and seeking new ideas." The component scales of this global measure are used in the analysis for Figure 3.
